INFUSION OVERVIEW

INDICATION

ALTUVIIIO™ [antihemophilic factor (recombinant), Fc-VWF-XTEN fusion protein-ehtl] is an injectable medicine that is used to control and reduce the number of bleeding episodes in people with hemophilia A (congenital Factor VIII deficiency).

Your healthcare provider may give you ALTUVIIIO when you have surgery.

You should not use ALTUVIIIO if you have had an allergic reaction to it in the past.

Ways to treat with ALTUVIIIO™

ROUTINE PROPHYLAXIS

Prevent bleeds or reduce their frequency with one infusion, once a week

ON-DEMAND TREATMENT

If a breakthrough bleed occurs, it can be treated with as little as one infusion

PERIOPERATIVE MANAGEMENT

Increase your bleed protection during and around the time of surgery

When storing ALTUVIIIO prior to reconstitution, keep it:

- in the original package to protect it from light
- refrigerated at 2°C to 8°C (36°F to 46°F); do not freeze
- or store it at room temperature, if needed, for up to 6 months.
 Do not let it exceed 30°C (86°F), and use within the expiration date.
 Do not return the product to the refrigerator

One way to infuse to fit your needs

Expect the same infusion process, whether it's weekly prophylaxis use, on-demand bleed control, or prior and post-surgery use

Ready to infuse?

Infuse with confidence! Use the reminder information below any time you need a refresher, once you've been trained on infusions by a healthcare provider. Remember to always review the Instructions for Use before infusing and reach out to your healthcare provider with any questions.



SETTING UP

- Gather medication and supplies
- Double-check the expiration date on the vial to be sure it's correct. Reach out to your healthcare provider if you have any questions about your dosage



INFUSING

- Wrap the tourniquet above where you plan to infuse and clean the site with an alcohol wipe
- Follow the Administration Steps in the Instructions for Use to slowly administer the solution. Infusing should take no less than 1-2 minutes for adults, and between 2-6 minutes for children depending on the child's weight



PREPARING FOR INFUSION

- Wash hands and prepare a clean work surface
- Give medicine time to come to room temperature, then reconstitute the powdered ALTUVIIIO™ with the diluent solution as directed.
- Administer reconstituted ALTUVIIIO as soon as possible. Reconstituted solution may be kept at room temperature, away from sunlight, for up to 3 hours



FINISHING UP

- Once you've infused the full dose, slowly remove the needle
- Throw away all used and unused medical supplies, including empty vials and unused solution, in the appropriate waste container—and you're done!





Infuse the same day each week prophylactically, so you never miss a dose—even when traveling

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

What is the most important information I need to know about ALTUVIIIO?

Do not attempt to give yourself an injection unless you have been taught how by your healthcare provider or hemophilia center. You must carefully follow your healthcare provider's instructions regarding the dose and schedule for injecting ALTUVIIIO so that your treatment will work best for you.

Who should not use ALTUVIIIO?

You should not use ALTUVIIIO if you have had an allergic reaction to it in the past.

What should I tell my healthcare provider before using ALTUVIIIO?

Tell your healthcare provider if you have had any medical problems, take any medications, including prescription and non-prescription medicines, supplements, or herbal medicines, are breastfeeding, or are pregnant or planning to become pregnant.

What are the possible side effects of ALTUVIIIO?

You can have an allergic reaction to ALTUVIIIO. Call your healthcare provider or emergency department right away if you have any of the following symptoms: difficulty breathing, chest tightness, swelling of the face, rash, or hives.

Your body can also make antibodies called "inhibitors" against ALTUVIIIO. This can stop ALTUVIIIO from working properly. Your healthcare provider may give you blood tests to check for inhibitors.

The common side effects of ALTUVIIIO are headache, joint pain, and back pain.

These are not the only possible side effects of ALTUVIIIO. Tell your healthcare provider about any side effect that bothers you or does not go away.
